Chamblee Charter High School is located in Chamblee, Georgia; a suburb of Atlanta. It is a public school in the DeKalb County School District and includes grades 9 through 12. The student body is composed of local attendance area students, as well as students drawn from throughout the county by way of selection to either the *Charter Program* or *Magnet Program for High Achievers*. The student body is culturally and economically diverse. Enrollment at the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year was approximately 1646, including 327 students in the graduating class of 2017.

COURSES: The school year is divided into two 18-week semesters. Students attend 7 periods per day, five days per week, with each class lasting 50 minutes. Courses are designed for college preparation, vocational, and career development. Many subjects are taught at an accelerated and/or magnet level. A variety of Advanced Placement opportunities are offered from ninth through twelfth grades. Advanced Placement courses include: Language/Composition, Literature/Composition, Biology, Environmental Science, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics C Mechanics, Physics C Electricity and Magnetism, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Human Geography, Psychology, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, World History, US History, Studio Art : 2D, Studio Art: 3-D, Studio Art: Drawing, Music Theory, Computer Science A, Spanish Language, and German Language.

GRADING SYSTEM: The grade point system is based on a 4.0 scale. Advanced Placement and Move on When Ready/Dual Enrollment courses are graded on a 5.0 scale.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION: Graduates must satisfactorily complete 24 prescribed units. All students must take the new Georgia Milestones End of Course (EOC) assessments in Ninth Grade Language Arts, American Literature, Coordinate Algebra, Analytic Geometry, United States History, Economics, Physical Science, and Biology.

HONORS 2015-2016: 12 National Merit Finalists. 10 Governor's Honors Program Finalists. The Chamblee Math Team ranked second in the state and first in 4A. Two math students were selected for the American Regional Mathematics League Team. Sixty-six members of the class of 2016 graduated with a 4.0 GPA or higher and fifty-nine percent qualified as *HOPE* Scholars. Our school newspaper & website, the *Blue and Gold*, continues to receive a superior rating from the GA Scholastic Press Association. The *National Council of Teachers of English* rated our literary magazine, *ETCETERA*, superior. Our yearbook, *The Chamhian*, was awarded the Gold Medal from Columbia Scholastic Press Association. CCHS is a Simon Certified High School with 16 Simon Scholars. One student was selected as a Posse Scholar. Sixteen students received the Deutsches Sprachdiplom, the DSD II, proof of German proficiency to fulfill the language requirement for attending any university or college in Germany."
