DCSD Promotion Policy

Students who enter the ninth grade in 2005–2006 and beyond are required to complete 360 hours (24 units) in order to meet the requirements for graduation. The requirements for promotion are as follows:

to the tenth grade: 90 hours (6 units), three (3) of which must be core courses* and three (3) elective courses

to the eleventh grade: 180 hours (12 units), six (6) of which must be core courses* and six (6) elective courses

to the twelfth grade: 270 hours (18 units), nine (9) core courses* and nine (9) elective courses

**core courses include English, mathematics, science, social studies, and world language*

Diploma Seals

- Honors/Distinction
 - 3.5 cumulative GPA & 3.0 core GPA
 - 3 years of the same world language

- College Prep
 - No GPA requirement
 - 2 years of same world language

- Career Technology
 - 1 year of same world language
 - 3 units of career tech electives in same pathway
 - No GPA requirement

Bi-literacy Seal

Students may earn a bi-literacy seal on their diploma if they meet the following requirements:

- (1) Completion of all English language arts requirements for graduation with an overall grade point average of 3.0 or above in those classes; and
- (2) Proficiency in one or more languages other than English, demonstrated by passing a foreign language advanced placement examination with a score of 4 or higher

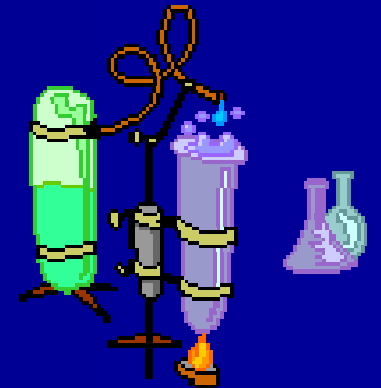

- ✓ You must have a minimum HOPE G.P.A. of 3.0 and meet course rigor requirements in order to qualify for the scholarship.
- ✓ The GA Student Finance Commission will recalculate your HOPE GPA to determine eligibility.
 - ✓ The Zell Miller Scholarship covers 100% tuition at a public college/university in the state of GA.
 - ✓ The HOPE Scholarship dollar amount varies per institution.
 - ✓ Social Security # must be active in Infinite Campus.
 - ✓ High school courses taken in 8th grade do not count.
 - ✓ AP and dual enrollment courses are weighted differently.

Dual Enrollment (11th & 12th)

- Earn high school & college credit at the same time!
- FREE! Tuition & books are paid for by the state.
- Dual enrollment courses will receive a 1.0 weight.
- Must have ACT/SAT scores in order to apply.
- Transportation is not provided.
- Full time dual enrollment students must take 4 classes. Part time dual enrollment students must take at least 5 classes between the college & CCHS.
- Each college will have separate admission requirements for dual enrollment students.
