To be eligible, applicant must have a cumulative, un-weighted GPA of 3.5 or above, be a graduating high school senior planning to attend a four-year accredited academic institution, be a high school senior in & legal resident of Colorado, Georgia, or Illinois, be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the U.S., and demonstrate financial need: household annual income may not exceed \$70,000. Applicants must also demonstrate the following: A strong interest and commitment to the community, an ability to persevere through difficult circumstances, and excellent leadership skills.
